ORDINANCE RESTRICTING THE KEEPING OF INOPERATIVE MOTOR VEHICLES ON PROPERTY IN THE TOWN OF ONLEY

At a regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Onley, Virginia, held on the 1st day of November, at which the Mayor and all members of Council were present, the following ordinance was adopted:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF ONLEY AS FOLLOWS:

1. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to keep, except within a fully enclosed building or structure, or otherwise shielded or screened from view, on any property within the corporate limits of the Town of Onley, any motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer, as such are defined in Code of Virginia, Section 46.1-1 which is inoperative. As used in this section, an "inoperative motor vehicle" shall mean any motor vehicle which is not in operating condition or which for a period of sixty days or longer has been partially or totally disassembled by the removal of tires and wheels, the engine or other essential parts required for operation of the vehicle or on which there are displayed neither valid license plates nor a valid inspection decal.

2. Any person, firm, or corporation violating or permitting the violation of this Ordinance by allowing anyone to keep an inoperative motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer on their property shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction

thereof, shall be fined not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) nor more than Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) for each offense.

3. Any person, firm, or corporation violating this ordinance shall be deemed to be guilty of a separate offense for each and every day a violation of this ordinance is committed, continued or permitted by such person, firm, or corporation, and shall be punishable as hereinabove provided.

4. It is hereby declared that an emergency exists and this ordinance shall be effective immediately.
